The security situation in the Red Sea is still precarious and the rerouting of ships around the Cape of Good Hope led to a reduction of shipping capacity and rising transport costs. At the moment it is still unclear when the Red Sea passage will be safe again. Regardless of the outcome of the conflict, the high number of ship deliveries in the current year will lead to a gradual increase in transport capacity, which shipping lines will naturally be eager to fill. On top of that, labour market imbalances, geopolitical conflicts and in some parts of

the world continuous high inflation rates are putting pressure on consumer behaviour.
