

# Shipping Carbon/Charcoal on CMA CGM Group Vessels New Regulations for Shipping Carbon/Charcoal

May 13, 2025

USA to/from World Effective June 1, 2025

Dear Valued Customer,

We would like to inform you about important changes regarding the shipping of carbon/charcoal on CMA CGM Group vessels. These changes are in accordance with the IMDG Code Amendment 42-24 and will be effective from June 1, 2025.

## Key Changes:

## 1. Special Provision 925 Removal:

• The previous Special Provision 925 has been removed.

#### 2. Introduction of Special Provision 978:

 All carbon/charcoal shipments are now classified as dangerous goods with no exemptions allowed.

#### **Mandatory Requirements:**

#### 1. Weathering and Temperature Control:

- Carbon must be weathered for at least 14 days before packaging.
- The temperature of the carbon must not exceed 40°C (104°F) on the day of packing.

#### 2. Packaging:

- Carbon must be packed in UN approved and certified packaging.
- Bulk packaging is prohibited.
- Specific packing instructions must be followed, and large packaging LP02 is prohibited.
- Packages must be marked with UN 1361 and labeled as Class 4.2.

#### 3. Documentation:

- Dangerous Goods Declaration (DGD)
- Weathering report (required prior to carriage)
- Vanning survey report (required prior to carriage)

## 4. Container Transport Unit (CTU):

- Hazardous identification on all four faces of the CTU.
- Placards are labeled as Class 4.2 and marked with UN 1361 when the shipment contains more than 4000 kgs of carbon/charcoal.

#### 5. Stowage within the Container Unit:

- A minimum gap of 30 cm must be left between the cargo and the top of the container.
- Proper and safer stuffing is strongly recommended following the CTU Code guidelines.
- The vanning survey report must include:
  - 1. Proper packing and securing of cargo.
  - 2. Good condition of packaging (no holes, tears, or wear).
  - 3. Ambient temperature at the time of stuffing.
  - 4. Temperature of the cargo when packed into the CTU (maximum 5°C above ambient temperature).
  - 5. Photo documentation of the stuffing process (empty, 1/3, 2/3, full) with temperature readings.
